SBTÜ İNGİLİZCE YETERLİK SINAVI HAKKINDA

- SBTÜ İngilizce Yeterlik sınavı **Dinleme, Okuma, Yazma ve Konuşma** sınavı olmak üzere 4 aşamadan oluşmaktadır.
- 1. Aşamada öğrenciler **Dinleme** sınavına tabi tutulurlar. Bu aşamadan 50 ve üzeri alan öğrenciler 2. aşamaya geçmeye hak kazanırlar.
- 2. Aşama olan **Okuma** sınavı okuma, dil bilgisi ve kelime bilgisi kısımlarından oluşmaktadır. Bu aşamadan 50 ve üzeri alan öğrenciler 3. Aşamaya geçmeye hak kazanırlar.
- 3. Aşama olan **Yazma** sınavı üç soru içerir. Öğrenciler sorulardan yalnızca bir tanesini tercih ederek cevaplarlar. Bu aşamadan 50 ve üzeri alan öğrenciler 4. Aşamaya geçmeye hak kazanırlar.
- 4. Aşama olan **Konuşma** sınavında öğrencilerin seçtikleri sorular üzerinde hedef seviyede kendilerini ifade edebilmeleri beklenir. Farklı soru tarzlarıyla öğrencilerin konuşma yetileri değerlendirilir.
- Her bir sınavın geçme notuna etkisi %25'tir. Öğrencinin hazırlık derslerinden muaf olabilmesi için sınav puanı ortalamasının minimum 60 olması gerekmektedir.

Little is known about the early life of Leonardo Da Vinci. He was born in Italy and had very little formal schooling—only some reading, writing, and practice with an abacus. He had to teach himself many things, including Latin, in order to be able to read the scientific books that held the knowledge he wanted. Until his death in France at the age of 67, he was constantly busy reading, making notes, observing and sketching. Besides carrying on his studies, he worked on various projects in Milan and Florence for the rulers of these cities. He discovered laws of biology and increased his knowledge of anatomy by dissecting corpses and making priceless drawings of the human body, including ones showing its internal structure. His genius showed itself not only in all the sciences but also in the arts. His drawings for sculptures surpassed any work that had been done; and his paintings, although in poor condition now, are masterpieces unequalled by any other artist. The “Mona Lisa” was a starting point for a new art and still fascinates its viewers. Another picture, “The Last Supper”, considered the most famous painting in the world, is a wonder of design. He has definitely been one of the most splendid figures of the human race with his everything in the history of man.
